To Whom it May Concern:

In our laundering facilities all the garments move around the plant on hangers powered by chain and sprockets. If our chain breaks, expands, or bind up on the sprockets it shuts everything down because the garments cannot get from one area to another. I have used and tried several different chain lubes to prevent the chain from expanding due to the excessive heat in the summer. The other major problem we were having is the lint from the clothing would stick to the chain causing the sprockets to bind up and break the chain. Sean and Dave recommended the Primrose 548 Chain and Cable Lube and guaranteed it would prevent both of those problems. At first I was skeptical because the thick, tacky lube seemed like it would cause more lint to stick to it, not less. One of my maintenance men and me applied the Primrose Chain Lube on a Friday afternoon after the plant had already shut down so it could sit over the weekend. First thing Monday morning we checked the chains before turning everything on and to my amazement there was only a very fine film across the entire chain. We have gone 4 months now without losing any chain! There is no lint at all on our chains anymore and they run tight all day. I would highly recommend the Primrose Chain and Cable to everyone. In addition to the chain and cable lube we have also switched our grease, hydraulic fluid, and air compressor oil to Primrose.
